



S'lichot Program, Service, and Dessert. Saturday, September 21, 2019, 7 pm at Westchester Reform Temple, 255 Mamaroneck Road, Scarsdale Together with friends from other local congregations, we will welcome Middle Eastern vocalist and composer, Galeet Dardashti, who will perform her acclaimed work, Monajat. Monajat (a Persian word meaning dialogue with God) re-imagines the *S'lichot* ritual with a gifted ensemble of musicians, an electronic soundscape, and dynamic live video art. Using Persian melodies and Hebrew texts, the work pays homage to Dardashti's grandfather, a master Persian classical vocalist. Through electronics, she defies time and performs with her grandfather.

Hike & Service on 2nd **Day Rosh Hashanah.** *Tuesday, October 1, 2019, 9 am - 2:30 pm, on Hogencamp Mountain, Harriman Park* This scenic 5 mile hike will be a time for reflection and regeneration - a fun and unrushed, meaningful outdoor experience for individuals, couples, and families. Hilly, moderately graded trails will require some light scrambling. There will be a spiritual and interactive mountaintop shofar service and a short closing Tashlich service at a pristine trailside lake. Exact finish time depends on the pace of the group. The hike is open to adults and children 8 and older. The deadline to RSVP is Sunday, September 29th!

Memorial Service. Sunday, October 6, 2019, 10:30 am Join us as we honor our beloved departed during the Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah — the Ten Days of Repentance — with a graveside memorial service at Sharon Gardens Cemetery, in the Temple Israel section.

"The Fasts You Are Choosing: Finding Meaning in our Tradition and Beyond" will be a discussion of different reasons people fast and different meanings attached to fasts in Judaism and other traditions. Jason Morris, Ph. D., is an Associate Professor and Chair of the Natural Sciences Department at Fordham University.

- Young Children's Services in the afternoons are designed for families with children up to age 5.
- Teens are encouraged to attend the teen-only program on Rosh Hashanah afternoon and to participate in leading the community-wide service on Yom Kippur afternoon.

Guests. High Holiday services are open to all. Security procedures demand everyone have tickets, but they are available to anyone who wishes to attend. We ask that you use the enclosed card if you plan on bringing guests with you to services. We always welcome your support and the suggested donation is \$120 per guest for each holiday, \$200 for both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.



Rabbi's Note

Dear chevrei (friends),

The great rabbi, Abraham Joshua Heschel, said that "To pray is to know how to stand and dwell upon a word." I believe this to be true, though it is not exclusive to prayer. Any meditative practice has the ability to help us focus on words – or any matter – and to ponder their meaning and what actions we should take once we have done our dwelling. While personally, I do have a regular practice of praying (I am a rabbi!), I find this to also be true with my running. People often ask if I get bored spending so much time running. The truth is, even on a three-hour run, I don't think that I have ever been bored. The rhythm of footfalls and breathing, the hum of traffic and whooshing of wind are the liturgy that give rise to my best thinking – about anything and everything. Sometimes, I'm pondering the deepest of concepts and others are spent making a checklist of the mundane tasks to be done in the day ahead. Regardless, the running gives me the time away from everything that would otherwise interrupt my thinking, allowing me to feel so fulfilled by the end of each run - like I did something besides my run.

Others, of course, do this through yoga, knitting or just taking the time to stare out the window. A recent study by the Academy of Management actually showed that any activity that allows for your mind to wonder for long periods of time, on one or more subjects, leads to drastically higher levels of creativity in every sense

 artistic, problem solving, fantasy and more.

Any prayer service that we have here lends itself to this concept. How often, without our prayer services, do we ponder concepts like peace, gratitude, peoplehood and mortality, to give a very short list? Certainly, life makes us come face-to-face with these issues from time to time, but for most of us, we have no set-aside time to really dwell on these issues at length. Generally, any service gives ample opportunity to do so. In fact, over the last few months, on Shabbat, my colleagues and I have gone out of our way to encourage people to let their minds wander and wonder throughout the service. The words of the prayer book, the melodies we sing, the mood we try to set, are all merely tools - uniquely Jewish tools – to enable us to dwell deeply on matters each of us should be thinking about regularly. At services, I have been telling the congregation flat out, that it is more than ok, encouraged in fact, to not turn the page every time we say so, or to read the commentaries at the bottom of the page, or to not read at all. Maybe just staring off into space while our music lifts one's spirit is enough to make space in our lives for the deep dwelling prayer is supposed to engender. Frankly, Heschel didn't think of Shabbat as a day of rest, rather a "Sanctuary in Time;" a way for us to make time itself sacred so that when Shabbat was done, we had done our spiritual best to meet the day-to-day emotionally prepared.

The upcoming holiday season takes these concepts and super-charges them. While there are many of the same themes in our High Holiday services as in any prayer service throughout the year, there are some concepts that we only, really, dwell on in a deep way at this time of

year such as repentance, the righteousness of our behavior, fulfillment, our relationships and our own future. Just like the themes that are supercharged on these holidays, so are those very Jewish tools of the words, the music and the rituals that stir the spirit to dwell deeply on those themes. The music of these days is unlike any other. The power of the words is unlike any other. So are the sounds of the shofar, the throng that will be praying together and sense of peoplehood they make us

I want to give you the same permission to dwell deeply these holidays, as I have been encouraging everyone to do on Shabbat. Not to dwell on your to-do list back at your desk, or when you'll have time to schedule the kids for a haircut. No, I'm giving you permission to use all of the sights, sounds and words to carry you to a place in your own mind and soul that you rarely go to. Tune the rest out.

Jewish tradition commands us to reflect on these themes at this time of year. I hope that you will take up the challenge. Rabbi Heschel was a great believer that our thinking and praying should both lead to action. The High Holidays convey the same message – pray sincerely, think deeply, and then, perhaps we will be our better selves in the year to come by acting differently than we have in the past.



Dear Temple Community,

We had an excellent summer at Kehillah School, full of fun and exploration! As autumn approaches, it is time to reset our classrooms and focus on our learning goals for the upcoming year. Our goal is to work together as a kehillah, a community, to teach appropriate physical, cognitive, and emotional skills through the teaching of Jewish values, Jewish holidays, and Torah, as well as an emergent curriculum.

This year, I am developing resource binders for every class that include child-friendly summaries of every Torah portion, relevant Hebrew words (as well as a general Hebrew glossary), and two activities for each age group that connect to the Torah and work on science, math, art, language, dramatic, motor, and/or social skills. These binders will be a springboard for teachers to utilize while lesson planning. I am also creating a Jewish holiday guide, complete with background information, classroom ideas, as well as book and song suggestions that will go in the binders. Last but not least, each month there will be a Jewish value explored and lived across the whole school, starting with *lechem l'r'ayveem*, feeding the hungry, and our High Holiday food drive.

While all of this is going on, the teachers will observe and note topics and activities which spark excitement and curiosity in the children. Those budding interests are turned into an engaging emergent curriculum that is uniquely significant to the learners and reflects the experiences of the children in that class. Students can work on all kinds of skills while exploring something they are genuinely curious about. This reflective and reflexive teaching method is designed to engage students, and then guide them through expanding their own knowledge.

We look forward to another year of growing and learning!


