### Important Information for the High Holidays at Temple Israel

#### COVID Protocols

- No one will be granted entry to the temple without a mask. A mask covering the mouth and nose **MUST BE WORN** at all times while inside the temple for all services and programs
- All service details are subject to change per CDC, State and local government guidance and the recommendations of the Temple Israel COVID Taskforce.
- All attendees will enter through the main doors. If there is a group ahead of you, please wait until they have checked in.
- Each individual must clean his/her hands with the alcohol-based sanitizer that is available at the entrance.
- Restrooms and coatroom will be limited to one person at a time.
- Water fountains will not be in use.
