Important Information for the High Holy Days at Temple Israel

All services are open seating and unreserved. Services will begin promptly, as scheduled.

- We will be using *Mishkan HaNefesh*, the Reform Movement's *machzor* (High Holy Days prayer book) at all services. Prayer books and handouts will be placed on the seats ahead of time, and should be left on the seats at the end of the service.
- Nametags will be mailed to members and guests upon registration for onsite services. For everyone's safety, your name tag and a photo ID will need to be presented. We are eager for every member to be with us throughout the High Holy Days season.



Under a Tent:

- Our services will take place under a tent.
- Masks are optional.
- Social distancing seating will be available.
- Registration required.
