All services are open seating and unreserved. Services will begin promptly, as scheduled.

- We will be using *Mishkan HaNefesh*, the Reform Movement's *machzor* (High Holy Days prayer book) at all services. Prayer books and handouts will be placed on the seats ahead of time, and should be left on the seats at the end of the service.
- Nametags will be mailed to members and guests after registration for onsite services before Erev Rosh Hashanah.
 For everyone's safety, your name tag and a photo ID will need to be presented.
